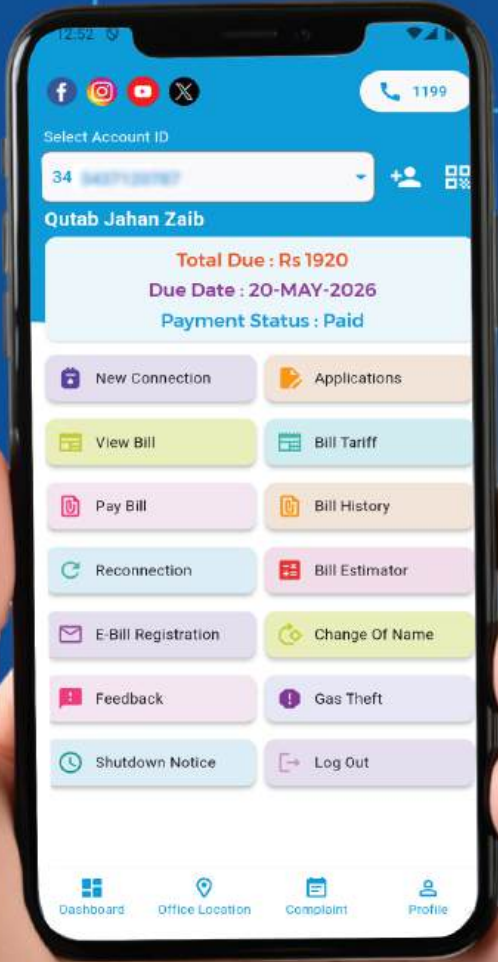


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MESSAGE FROM

HSE WEEK 2026 PROMOTING A CULTURE OF SAFETY AND EXCELLENCE

Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited successfully observed HSE Week in April 2026 across the Company, reaffirming its strong commitment to promoting a proactive Health, Safety and Environment (HSE) culture at all operational levels. The initiative was taken by ensuring the implementation of austerity measures as advised by the Management and aimed to actively engage employees and encourage a sense of shared responsibility towards safe work practices, environmental stewardship and continuous improvement in HSE performance.

The week featured a diverse range of interactive, practical and knowledge-based activities designed to enhance awareness and participation. Employees from various departments took part through a structured nomination process, ensuring inclusive involvement and fostering a spirit of healthy competition.

A key focus of the event was on identifying and mitigating workplace risks through activities such as Hazard Identification and Rectification, where participants demonstrated their ability to recognize hazards and implement corrective measures, supported by documented evidence. Workplace organization and safety standards were reinforced through housekeeping inspections, highlighting the importance of maintaining clean and hazard-free environment.

Practical preparedness and emergency response capabilities were emphasized through firefighting and first aid mock drills, enabling participants to develop confidence in handling emergency situations effectively. In addition, contractor awareness sessions were conducted to align external stakeholders with organizational HSE requirements and reinforce compliance through formal commitment.

Environmental responsibility and teamwork



were promoted through a waste management-based team building activity, where participants worked on proper segregation of hazardous and non-hazardous waste in an engaging and collaborative manner.

The program also included speech competitions and quiz sessions, encouraging participants to articulate and demonstrate their understanding of HSE principles. Specialized third-party training sessions further enriched the learning experience by covering critical topics such as road safety, emergency response and first aid. A defensive driving competition for motorcyclists was also organized, focusing on practical evaluation of safe driving skills and reinforcing the importance of road safety in daily operations.

commitment displayed by employees throughout the event reflected a strong and growing safety culture within the Company. Outstanding performers were recognized and awarded, further motivating employees to actively contribute towards HSE excellence.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES AND THE PIPELINE TRACK

Outdoor activities are essential for maintaining physical health. Activities such as hiking and cycling provide excellent cardiovascular workouts, strengthening the heart and lungs while improving overall endurance. Regular participation in these activities are helpful in managing weight, reduce the risk of chronic diseases like diabetes and hypertension, and enhance muscle and bone strength. Outdoor activities encompass a wide range of recreational pursuits that can be enjoyed in natural settings.

A perfect example is the pipeline Track, a unique corridor that transforms a functional utility route into a scenic journey through the heart of the landscape.

A Five Person Journey Through the Heart of Galyat

There is a specific kind of magic that happens when five friends leave the humidity of the plains and the noise of city life behind to step into the cool of Nathia Gali. The Pipeline Track, a historic 4-kilometer stretch connecting Dunga Gali to Ayubia, is more than just a walking path, it's a corridor of memories.

The Beginning (High Energy and High Expectations)

The entrance to the Pipeline Track is deceptive. It starts near the iconic wooden church in Nathia Gali, tucked away behind a veil of ancient trees.

Our group was a comedy of personalities. There was a "Selfie King" who couldn't walk ten steps without finding the "perfect light". The "Historian" who kept trying to explain the 19th century engineering of the water pipes and lecturing a tree about British irrigation. The "Always Hungry" friend who had already finished half of the food items before we reached the first kilometer. The "Fitness Guru" (he was actually not) lectured us on proper rhythmic breathing and glute engagement. Within twenty minutes he was leaning against a rock, red faced and heavy breathing. The "Vlogger" (Without a Camera) didn't even have a YouTube channel but he acted like he was hosting a National Geographic Special. He kept walking ahead and narrating our every move in a terrible accent.

Gossips Under the Canopy

The beauty of the Pipeline Track lies in its flat

surface, one may not lose breath from exertion. As we moved deeper into the Ayubia National Park, the dense canopy of Himalayan Cedar and Blue Pine trees closed in over us, creating a natural boulevard.

Every few hundred meters, our deep conversations were interrupted by the screech of monkeys. At one point, a large male monkey sat directly in the middle of the path, looking at us with the judgmental gaze of a landlord.

The Halfway Point (Mist and Memories)

By the time we reached the halfway mark, the weather did what the Galyat does best: it changed its mind. A thick, white mist began to roll up from the valley floor. Within minutes, the friends walking just five feet ahead became ghostly shadows.

The atmosphere shifted from high-energy joking to something more peaceful. We stopped at one of the small wooden benches built into the hillside. As we sat there, the "Always Hungry" friend finally revealed the secret of snacks stall few steps away from our hut.

The Final Stretch to Ayubia

The last two kilometers toward Ayubia offer some of the most dramatic views. As the path began to widen near the Ayubia end, we saw the familiar sights of the chairlift in the distance. We were tired, our shoes were dusty, and our phone galleries were completely full, but the energy was higher than when we started.

The Pipeline Track reminded us that while the destination is beautiful, the people you walk with make the journey memorable. Whether we are five people or fifty, those four kilometers will stay with us long after the mountain air has left our lungs. We don't just hike to see the view; we hike to reconnect with one another away from the noise of digital world. The trail may eventually fade but the echoes of our shared laughter will remain in our memory. It wasn't just a walk through the wilderness; it was a shared heartbeat in the great outdoors.

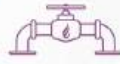
