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Visit of Mirza Mahmood Ahmad Director / Chairman HRC to SNGTI

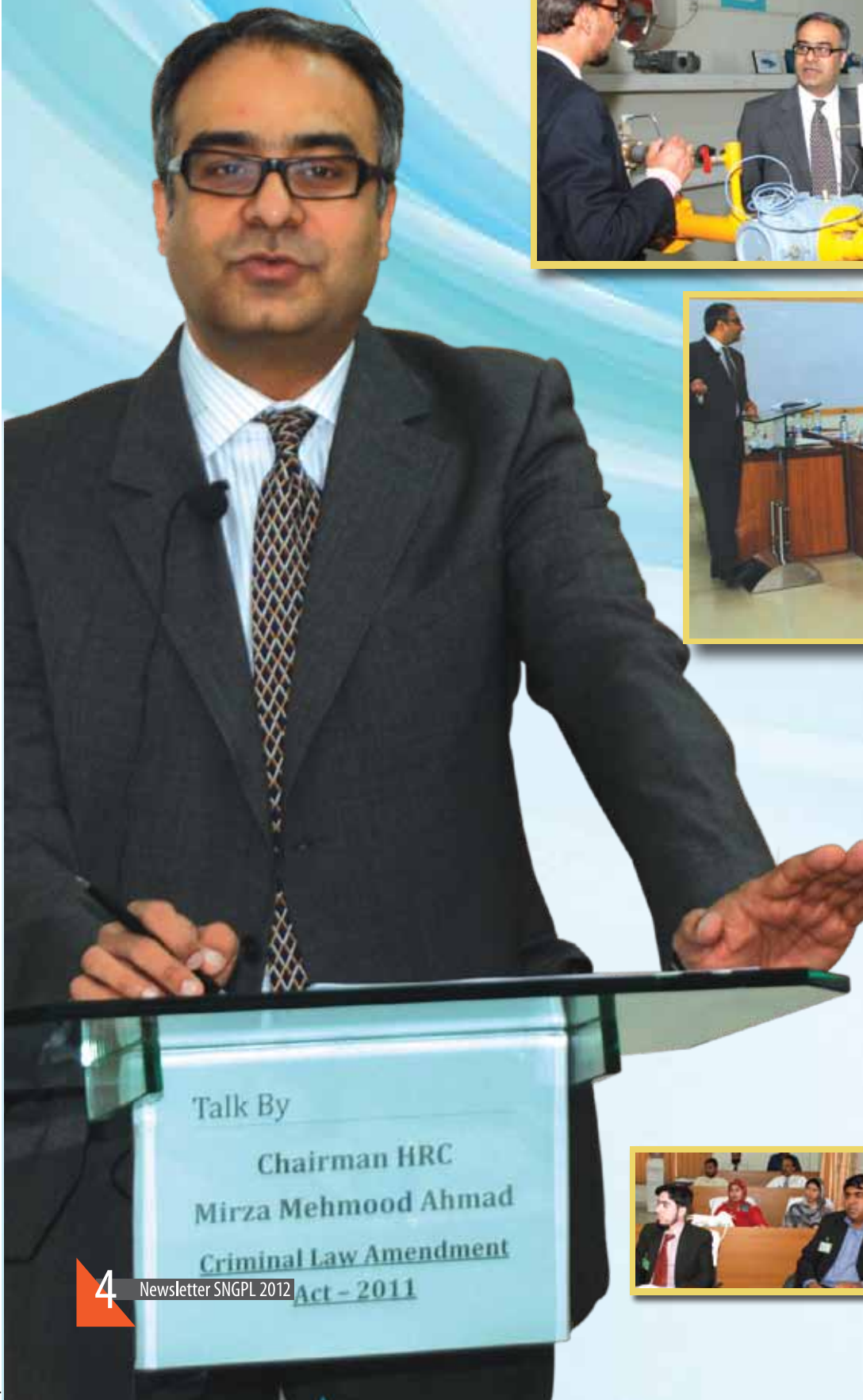

Supply of Gas Under People's Works Program-II (PWP-II)

During the past three years gas supply to 5 DHQs. Bahawalnagar, Bhakkar Narowal, D.I. Khan and Hangu has been commissioned. In addition to the above, 16 THQs. (Liaquatpur, Hasilpur, Chishtian, Haroonabad, Bhowana, Sahiwal, Sillanwali, Phalia, Safdarabad, Khanqah Dogran, Shakargarh, Zafarwal, Piplan, Banda Daud Shah, Takht-e-Nusrati and Sarai Naurang) 42 Towns and 1125 New Villages have been connected to gas Network.

Moreover 3528 schemes worth Rs. 46 billion have been approved under PWP-II. 27980 km of pipeline network is required to be laid for their completion. Out of these 3528 schemes, 1850 schemes have been completed and 1135 schemes are in progress. Detailed engineering drawings and material procurement is under process for remaining schemes.

So far 17950 Km (64%) pipeline network has been laid in the above schemes against a total network of 27980 Km.

By implementing these schemes, population of about 13 million would benefit from the facility of Natural Gas.

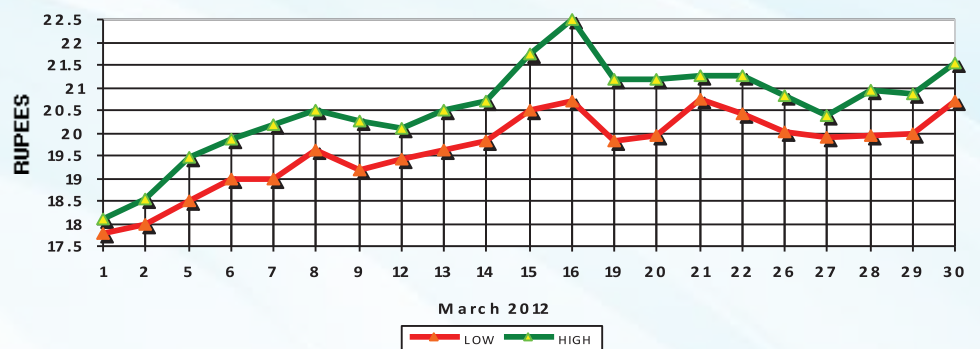

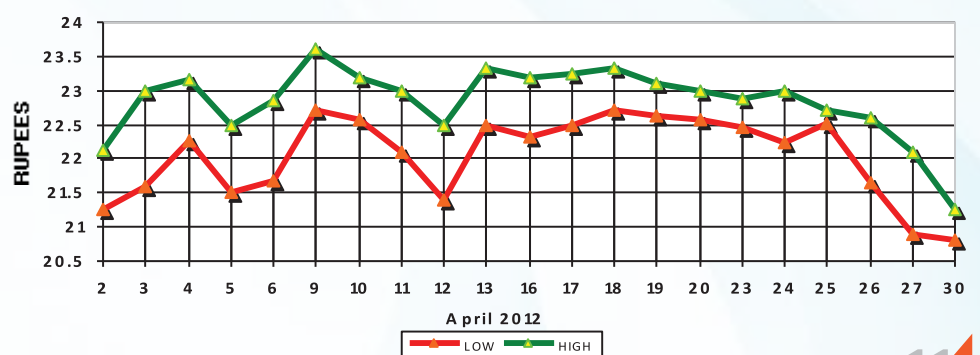

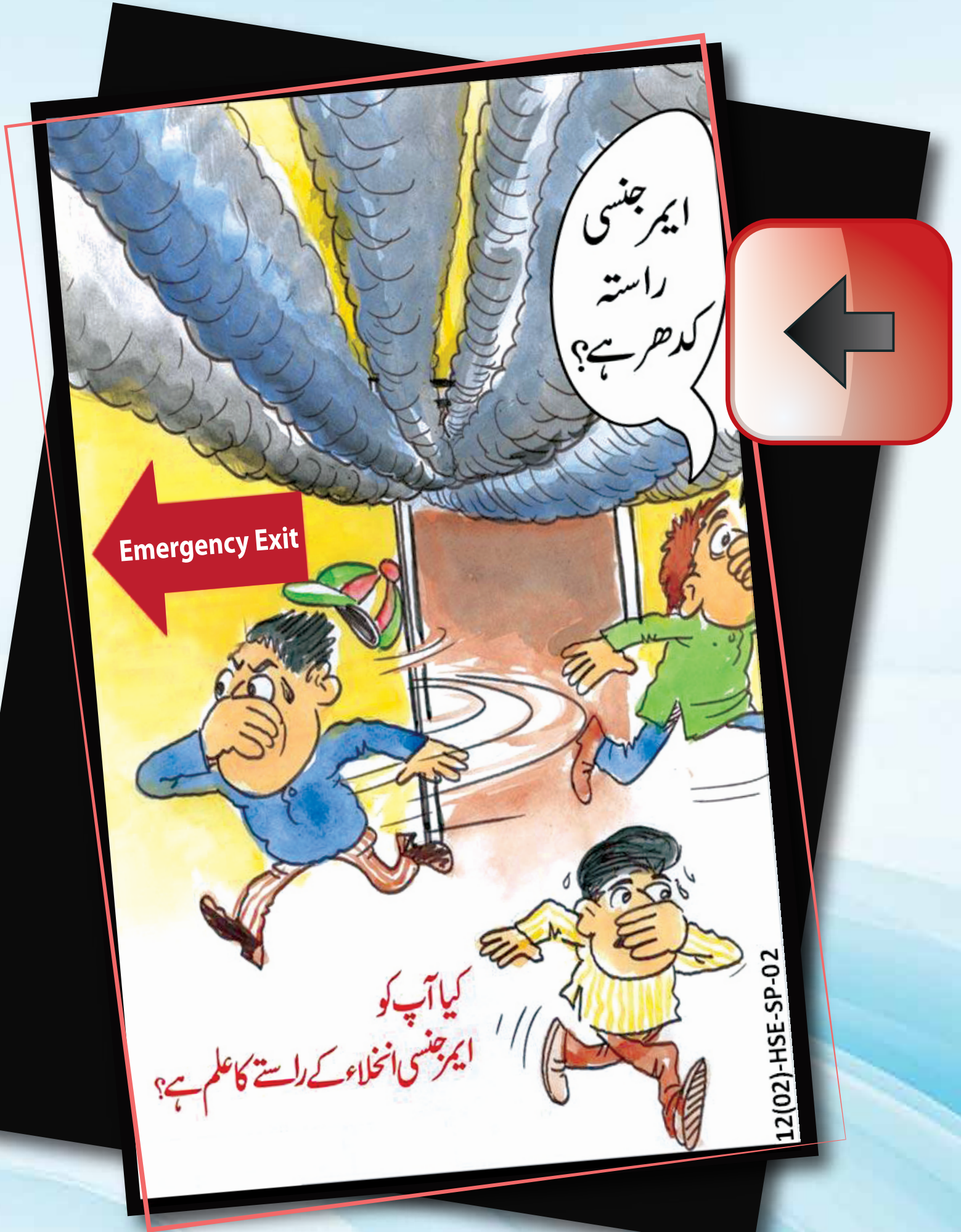
